

PsycINFO

Access: *PsycINFO* is available from all networked computers on campus and is SFX enabled.

Scope: *PsycINFO*, produced by the American Psychological Association, is the most comprehensive database of psychology. It is an electronic bibliographic database that provides abstracts and citations to the scholarly literature in the behavioral sciences and mental health. The database includes material of relevance to psychologists and professionals in related fields such as psychiatry, management, business, education, social science, neuroscience, law, medicine, and social work.

It contains over 1,900,000 records providing access to international academic, research, and practice literature in psychology and the behavioral aspects of related disciplines, with theoretical and practical information on general and experimental psychology. In addition to journal articles and books/chapters, *PsycINFO* includes dissertations, government documents and technical reports in one comprehensive database with full thesaurus functionality.

Dates of Coverage: From the 1800's to the present; updated weekly. There is a one-month delay in indexing after publication.

Print Equivalent: *PsycINFO* corresponds to the printed *Psychological Index* and *Psychological Abstracts*, which can be found in the Psychology Library in Green Hall.

Search Tips: Seek assistance from the "Database Guide" and "Help" screens when searching.
