

Each computer station at the Video Library has Audacity installed and is equipped with a headset and a built-in mic. Audio can be recorded using Audacity, saved and emailed or uploaded to Blackboard. We can help you create your audio file, no appointment is needed. Audacity is a free download for Mac, Windows and Linux OS.

Download the Audacity program from: http://audacity.sourceforge.net/ or http://audacity.sourceforge.net/ or http://audacityteam.org/download/ along with the LAME MP3 encoder - (Allows Audacity to export MP3 files.)

To begin recording your voice:

- Open Audacity by going to Start All Programs Audacity (Mac users will need to Search for the program)
- Recording Window opens (if recording window does not open automatically, go to File – New)
- Click on the pink dot and start recording
- To Stop, click on the yellow square. To Playback recording, click on the green arrow.
- Next go to File and scroll down to "Export as MP3" or "Export Audio". Type in name and save it to the desktop as an .mp3 file.
- Windows: At this point a message may appear asking for the lame.dll file. If this happens, navigate to where you downloaded the file (probably the desktop). Extract the lame.dll file.
- ➤ When the Edit ID Tags/Metadata...window appears select OK without making any changes
- Mac: At this point a message may appear asking for the lame.dll file. If this happens, navigate to where you downloaded the file (probably the desktop). Extract the lame.dll file.
- Close Audacity. When window appears asking to save changes click 'no'.
- > To playback the file click on the green button in Audacity or open it in Windows Media Player or Quicktime from the desktop after you have saved it.
